Course Description:

The Society for Airway Management (SAM) is comprised of a multidisciplinary group of health care providers from Anesthesiology, Emergency Medicine, Otolaryngology, Critical Care, and Pulmonology, as well as CRNAs, NPs, PAs, paramedics, and nurses. The **SAM 23rd Annual Scientific Meeting and Workshop** has been developed to feature international experts in the various fields of medicine dealing with airway management. Many aspects of difficult airway management, in a variety of clinical settings, will be highlighted. This course will consist of plenary presentations, small group round table discussions, hands-on workshops, and research poster rounds. Audience engagement will be encouraged with question periods and an audience response system.

The theme of this year's meeting is:

Improving the Safety of Airway Management Across Multiple Clinical Settings**COURSE OBJECTIVES: At the conclusion of the conference, the participant will be able to:**

1. Discuss the various published airway guidelines (ASA, CAFG, PUMA)
2. Discuss the important concepts learned from airway registry data in multiple clinical environments (prehospital, emergency department, intensive care unit)
3. Describe the different airway management strategies for patients with physiologically difficult airways
4. Describe the different airway management strategies for obese patients requiring sedation outside the operating room
5. Discuss the importance of timing of intubation in the management of hypoxemic COVID patients
6. Describe the role of different airway management strategies (face mask ventilation, supraglottic device ventilation and tracheal intubation) in patients with cardiac arrest
7. Describe the important airway considerations in the pediatric patient requiring intubation
8. Describe the important airway considerations in the parturient requiring intubation

Target Audience: Anesthesiologists, emergency physicians, otolaryngologists, intensivists, trauma surgeons, paramedics, certified registered nurse anesthetists, anesthesia assistants, nurse practitioners, physician assistants and flight nurses and all other allied health professionals involved with airway management should attend.

Call for Abstracts: Be a part of one of the most rewarding sessions of the annual meeting. Submit your abstract for consideration as a poster presentation. All accepted posters will have a moderated walk around poster session. The Top 3 abstracts will be eligible for oral presentation during the meeting.

Airway on Demand
Thursday, September 15, 2022 - 12:00 – 6:00 pm

Airway on Demand (AOD) is an A-to-Z update of the current trends in airway management designed for the clinicians responsible for managing airways. The course will cover topics such as the new ASA Difficult Airway Infographic, advanced airway evaluation, pediatric airway management, awake intubation, new video laryngoscopes, the role of new supraglottic airways in difficult airway management, invasive airway access and difficult extubation. AOD is being offered to the clinician who wants a solid review of the current devices and techniques, before attending SAM, where more advanced ideas are shared.

Educational Objectives: Participants who attend this course will be able to:

1. Explain the 2022 ASA Difficult Airway Adult Infographics.
2. Develop an appropriate airway management plan based on the findings of a focused medical history and airway physical exam and apply these plans to patient care.
3. Apply principles of advanced airway evaluation to the synthesis of an appropriate airway plan.
4. Assess their plan of airway rescue and routine tracheal intubation with the incorporation of modern optical/video devices.
5. Assess their plan of airway rescue and routine airway management with the incorporation of modern supraglottic airways.
6. Apply patient preparation techniques in the performance of awake tracheal intubation.
7. Apply techniques of minimally invasive airway rescue.
8. Evaluate the potential for failed tracheal extubation and develop a plan for emergency reintubation.
