Course Description:

The Society for Airway Management (SAM) is comprised of a multidisciplinary group of health care providers from Anesthesiology, Emergency Medicine, Otolaryngology, Critical Care, and Pulmonology, as well as CRNAs, AAs, NPs, PAs, RNs and paramedics. The **SAM 26th Annual Scientific Meeting and Workshop** has been developed to feature international experts in the various fields of medicine dealing with airway management. Many aspects of difficult airway management, in a variety of clinical settings, will be highlighted. This course will consist of plenary presentations, small group round table discussions, and hands-on workshops.

The theme of this year's meeting is: **Improving Airway Management Across the Continuum – One Life Matters, No Matter Where**

Course Objectives: At the conclusion of the conference, the participants will be able to:

1. Discuss current approaches and unique challenges to airway management in clinical practice across the spectrum of care locations, including prehospital, hospital, and office-based settings.
2. Discuss historical perspectives and future directions and challenges in technological innovation in airway management.
3. Discuss unique airway management systems-based and cognitive challenges for clinicians working as part of the transient workforce.
4. Describe specific approaches to airway management in prehospital rescue care.
5. Describe specific approaches to lung isolation in the emergency room.
6. Describe approaches and techniques for managing the narrowed airway.
7. Describe important technological, cognitive, and system-based considerations for airway management in the neonatal/pediatric and obstetric populations.
8. Describe specific approaches to oxygenation and methods to prevent cardiovascular collapse in critically ill patients.
9. Discuss current guidelines and approaches for (a) upper bronchoscopy airway management, (b) use of point-of-care ultrasound in airway management, and (c) the prevention of unrecognized esophageal intubation.

Target Audience: Anesthesiologists, emergency physicians, otolaryngologists, intensivists, trauma surgeons, paramedics, certified registered nurse anesthetists, anesthesia assistants, respiratory therapists, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, flight nurses and all other allied health professionals involved with airway management should attend.

Call for Abstracts: All accepted posters will have a moderated walkaround poster session. The top 3 abstracts will be eligible for oral presentation during the meeting.

Challenging Airway Cases Session: Case reports have introduced new paradigms, increased awareness of clinicians to complications, and have likely saved countless lives. They have also sparked ideas for clinical studies. The SAM Board of Directors acknowledges the contributions of challenging cases in the past by our members to advance our discipline.

New Speaker Forum Lightning Presentation: SAM is proud to announce the continuation of this session developed to encourage fellows and junior faculty participation. Three speakers will be selected to each present a 15 minute "lightning presentation" on a current topic of interest in airway management.

International chapters - white papers submission: SAM honors the work and participation of its international chapter members. This session hosts submissions from the SAM international chapters members. Three speakers will be selected to each present a 15-minute presentation on a current topic of interest in airway management and/or on the work of a specific SAM international chapter.

Trainee Travel Awards: We particularly encourage residents and fellows to submit their scientific work. A select number of resident abstracts will be awarded a cash stipend of \$300 to defray travel costs. Trainee award winners will also receive free meeting registration. The trainee must be the first and presenting author of the accepted abstract. A letter from the Program Director confirming the resident is in good standing in their training program must accompany the submission. Awards will be announced at the Annual Meeting.

Airway on Demand
(Other/blended learning - Video & in-person format course)

Faculty: Dr. William Rosenblatt, M.D.

Airway on Demand (AOD) is an A-to-Z update of the current trends in airway management designed for the clinicians responsible for managing airways. The course will cover topics such as the new ASA Difficult Airway Infographic, advanced airway evaluation, pediatric airway management, awake intubation, new video laryngoscopes, the role of the new supraglottic airways in difficult airway management, invasive airway access and difficult extubation. AOD is being offered to the clinician who wants a solid review of the current devices and techniques, before attending SAM, where more advanced ideas are shared.

Educational Objectives: Participants who attend this course will be able to:

1. Explain the 2022 ASA Difficult Airway Adult Infographics.
2. Develop and appropriate airway management plan based on the findings of a focused medical history and airway physical exam and apply these plans to patient care.
3. Apply principles of advanced airway evaluation to the synthesis of an appropriate airway plan.
4. Assess their plan of airway rescue and routine tracheal intubation with the incorporation of modern optical/video devices.
5. Assess their plan of airway rescue and routine airway management with the incorporation of modern supraglottic airways.
6. Apply patient preparation techniques in the performance of awake tracheal intubation.
7. Apply techniques of minimally invasive airway rescue.
8. Evaluate the potential for failed tracheal extubation and develop a plan for emergency reintubation.
